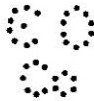

Perfins plus from Albuquerque, NM

As has become tradition in the *Bulletin* below are shown the perfins of Albuquerque, our host city. Two years ago I presented the short list of perfins and precancels from Charleston, SC, that year's host city. Only three perfins and one preper were recorded for that location, with a single precancel listed for North Charleston (the actual location of the Convention hotel; a short list, but longer than that for Albuquerque!

Perfins: Only two perfins are reported with their primary user in Albuquerque; a branch office of the Continental Oil Company (C242-1) and a branch office of The New York Life Insurance Company (N113AB-00) (Endicott 2021).

There are three additional listings of primary users from New Mexico: F. E. Lester Company, Mesilla Park (F070); State Highway Department, Santa Fe (S141); and, The Mountain States Telephone Company, Santa Fe (T034).

And, although there are *no supplemental users* listed for Albuquerque, there are three reports of supplemental usages from New Mexico: The Mountain States Telephone Company, (PM) Taos (T034); another with a Santa Fe PM; and, The Mountain States Telephone & Telegraph Company (of Denver, CO) postmarked Las Cruces, NM (M227)

Precancels: There are quite a few precancels listed for Albuquerque (PSS 2019). Below are shown the types of precancel available from Albuquerque. (Note: I did not have examples of Albuquerque precancels for Ty. 413 or Ty. 623; substitutes from the PSS Style chart are presented.)



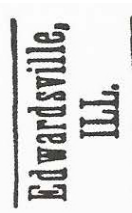

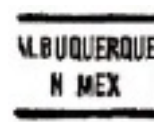

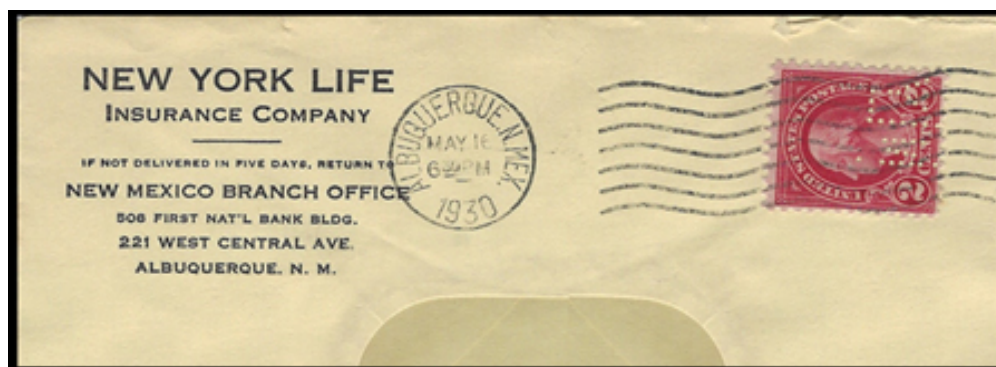

Despite thirteen precancels being listed for Albuquerque, there are **no prepers** reported for the city nor, in fact, for the entire state of New Mexico (Smith 2020).



The good news for any collector trying to complete a collection of perfin and precancels related to our Convention city is that the most expensive items in the list are the C242-1 and P070 perfins, both of which are C+ rated patterns. All other items on the list are cataloged at \$3 or less (several items are priced at \$.15). The bad news is - collecting pieces in the supplemental category requires a cover or SOTN cancel validating use in Albuquerque, a not so easy nut to crack.

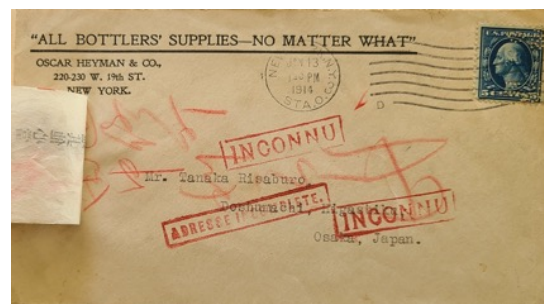
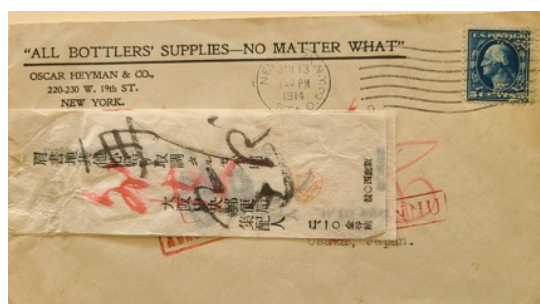

An Interesting Perfin Cover

I recently acquired the attached perfin cover from a member of my local stamp club -- Steve Pla. It is a nice cover with a split C+ perfin (O036) from Oscar Heyman & Co. New York, NY. The catalog lists usage 9/13/1919 - 11/1/1921. This postmark date extends the earliest known usage by 5 years to 1/13/1914.



The cover is stamped in red "Adresse Incomplete" and "Inconnu" ("Address Unknown" and "Unknown person or thing").

What makes this cover unique are the 2 strips of tissue paper attached to the front with lots of Japanese writing (kanji) on them. I was immediately curious about the purpose of the pieces of paper. Steve used his knowledge of Chinese to come up with some of the characters in the Japanese script. He said the writing concerned the undeliverable nature of the cover. The cover was postmarked Jan 13, 1914, and contains a receipt stamp in Osaka on Feb. 5, 1914. The process of attempting to deliver it continued for some time after that.

I then contacted the Japanese Club at the University of New Mexico and asked if they could help translate. Three days later I got an email from Soutaro, an exchange student from Japan who assisted in the translation. He supported Steve's theory. One group of kanji contains info about the Osaka Central Post Office and markings of its manager. Another group of kanji tells how the postman looked for any other places to deliver the letter but couldn't figure out where.

Another mystery -- the corner envelope information implies that Oscar Heyman & Co. sells supplies to bottlers, but a current Google search lists the company as a high-end jewelry manufacturer which started in 1912. The company is still in business, and I'm attempting to contact them to see if they can enlighten me.

Ed. Note: Flipping the Google search to read "bottling supplies and Heyman" I was able to confirm (from a billhead dated 1900) that there was an "Oscar Heyman & Co." located at 42 Vesey St. in New York.



The billhead identifies them as "Manufacturers & Importers" and also lists for sale "Bottle Caps, Tin Foil, Bottle Wrappers, Labels, Machinery" and, finally, "BOTTLERS SUPPLIES". Oscar Heyman & Brothers "Makers of Platinum Jewelry" was established in 1912 by Serbian immigrant brothers (Oscar, Nathan & Harry) who arrived in the U. S. from the Ukraine in 1906 (Harry arrived in 1907). It appears that there were two Oscar Heymans with no apparent connection between the two establishments. However, the same names of the proprietors continue to be of interest. The similarity is either coincidental, or, possibly, the owner of the bottling supply company was related to the founder of the jewelry company.

Distinguishing S002-63 from S002-63A

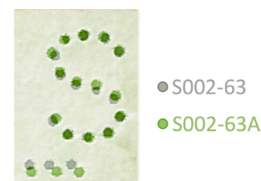

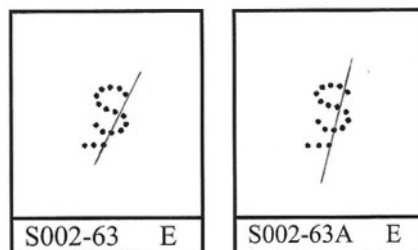
The Swift & Company perfin S002-63 from S002-63A are very close in appearance, but I believe we can be confident that they were produced from different perforators. During recent conversations with Russ Sampson from Canada about a possible new perfin discovered in Canada, I decided to closely study the two U.S. patterns.

Jean Guy Dalpé of the British North American Philatelic Society's (BNAPS) Perfin Study Group has recently discovered what appears to be the very first S002-63 in a Canadian stamp. The stamp is a Scott #108, 3-cent brown wet-printed King George V "Admiral" which was issued August 6, 1918. As separate information, there is also a lone reported S002-63A in a Canadian stamp. This Canada perfin is in a Scott #327, the 3-cent carmine rose QE II "Karsh" issued May 1, 1953. This rare Canadian perfin has a Toronto cancel dated August 24, 1956. The perfin in the Scott #327 is catalog #S6 in the 6th Edition of the Handbook of Canadian Stamps with Perforated Initials (Graham and Sampson editors, 2025). To tell whether the two ultra-rare Canadian perfins are a) from two different machines or b) are die varieties from a single machine, we attempted to put the S002-63 and S002-63A on better empirical footing, as will be discussed in this article.

Back to the two U.S. perfins:

1. There is a small difference in the length of the 3 holes beneath the letter S, the length being very slightly longer in S002-63 (3.5mm) than in S002-63 (3.0mm). Also, the 3 holes are slightly closer to the letter S in S002-63 than in S002-63A.
2. As Russ pointed out to me, the top of the letter S appears "squished" in S002-63A and the loop is pointed at the left side.
3. Significantly, we have discovered that the differences can be determined by drawing a line as shown on the next page. Draw a line through the right control hole and the third hole in the bottom of the letter S, counting the holes from the left in the bottom of the letter S. The resultant line will pass, vertically, to the right of the top hole of the letter S in S002-63. However, the resultant line will pass to the left of the top hole of the letter S in S002-63A.





4. Finally, Steve studied his 161 copies of the two patterns (all off-cover). All 53 perfins of S002-63 are in U.S. stamps issued between 1908 to 1922. The 108 perfins of S002-63A are all seen in U.S. postage issued later – 1926 to 1941. This date separation is also true of the perfins in the two Canadian stamps, as mentioned on the previous page, and in covers provided by Dan Baugher and John Welsch. This is further evidence to the hypothesis that there were two different perforators, since no overlap has been seen in the stamp issues nor in the ECU and LKU dates.

Until now, most of us have been using point #1 above to distinguish between these two perfins. With the additional tools described in this article, we can spot previous identification errors. There are several errors in the sub-collection checklists that are posted on our Club website. In full disclosure, several of those errors are mine, which are now being corrected.

Finally, given this improved analysis, especially using item #4 above, I seriously doubt the accuracy of the periods of use and the postmarks as posted in the *U.S. Perfins Catalog*. I will revise them as shown below in red font.

A Study of Very Similar Patterns

As collectors we encounter, from time to time, those perfins that appear very similar to another pattern listed in our *Catalog*. We are beginning a study of such very similar patterns to decide whether one in the pair should be deleted. In the previous issue of the *Bulletin* we discussed similar patterns in Letter Sections A and B. In this article, we will discuss similar patterns in Letter Sections C, D and E. In future issues we will continue to present discussions of a few of these problematic patterns.

What have we considered in this process? Are the primary users and towns the same or different? Are the usage periods the same, interlocking or significantly separate? What stamps have been seen with the perfins? Do electronic overlays of these similar patterns match within 0.5mm? Do confirming covers exist?

Your input is essential. Do you have supporting or differing information? Please send scans. Use flatbed scans and capture at 300dpi. NO cellphone scans. And please send scans of multiples, blocks, strips, etc. – they can provide important information. We have seen scaling issues with some similar patterns, where the illustrations from the 1980s are not accurate to 100% size.

Over time, our technology tools have improved, and our database of backup information is far more robust than even 20 years ago. Certainly, in the past, innocent identification errors could have been made for a variety of reasons, including not knowing about the similar perfin, identification errors, tired eyeballs, etc. This can result in the incorrect recording of dates.

Here are the 10 pairs of very similar patterns including one pattern in each of two pairs that we propose to delete. We studied eight other pairs that we believe should be left in the *Catalog*.

Proposed Deletions (overlays are shown below in two configurations – with either pattern on top):

C250A	as a minor variety of C250
E047A	as a minor variety of E047



C250A over C250



C250 over C250A



E047A over E047



E047 over E047A

With regards to C250 vs C250A, the illustration of C250A pattern is slightly rotated in the *Catalog*, resulting in it visually appearing to be different from C250.

We also studied and decided to retain the following eight similar pairs in the *Catalog*. The letters and/or the pin holes are positioned differently:

B181	and	B181A and B181.5
C023	and	C023A
C323	and	C323A
D051	and	D051A

D072	and	D072A
D084	and	D084A
E036	and	E036.5

Perhaps you disagree with our conclusions. That is okay. One of the wonderful things about collecting perfin is that we can collect them any way we want. So, keep those differing patterns if you wish, describe them as such and enjoy them.

Please let us know if there are other patterns in Letter Sections A through E that you would like to have studied.

Wanted Holey General Pulaskis

This note got me thinking and I decided that - why not - let's have a checklist of patterns found in the Pulaski issue. So, here is a checklist of the relevant perfin based on Endicott's Dec 2024 2¢ red list on the Club's website:

The Federal Reserve Banking System and Perfins

A system of Federal Reserve Banks was established December 23, 1913, by the Congress as the operating arm of the nation's central banking system. Many of the services provided to depository institutions and the federal government by this network of Reserve Banks are similar to services provided by commercial banks and thrift institutions to business customers and individuals. However, the Federal Reserve Banks do not provide banking services, including accounts, to individuals.

Federal Reserve Banks have a variety of functions. Not all banks provide the full spectrum of functions. Primary functions of these Banks are to:

- provide accounts to depository institutions--banks, thrifts, and credit unions--in which those institutions hold reserve balances;
- make loans to depository institutions;
- move currency and coin into and out of circulation;
- collect and process millions of checks and other payments each day;
- provide checking accounts and other services for the Treasury;
- issue and redeem government securities;
- conduct auctions and buybacks of federal debt
- act in other ways as fiscal agent for the U.S. government
- supervise and examine all bank holding companies and commercial banks that are members of the Federal Reserve System for safety and soundness, and
- participate in the setting of national monetary policy (Anon. 2021).

The System includes 12 District Banks, almost all with Branch Offices

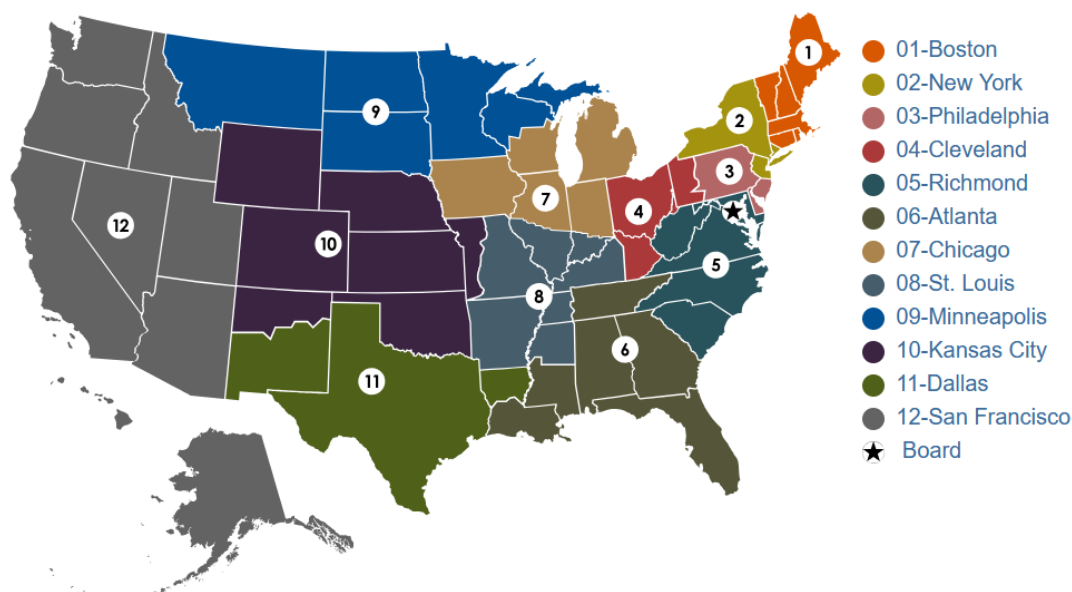


Figure 2. Map showing the geographic extent of the 12 Federal Reserve Banks authority. "Board" refers to the location of the Federal Reserve Board's Headquarter location (Washington, D.C.) (Anon. 2017)






Historically the Reserve Banks compensated member banks for keeping reserves on deposit (unavailable for lending) by paying them a dividend from earnings, limited by law to 6 percent. The Emergency Economic Stabilization Act (EESA) of 2008 additionally authorized the Reserve Banks to pay interest on member bank reserves, while the FAST Act of 2015 imposed an additional dividend limit equal to the yield determined in the most recent 10-year Treasury Note auction.

Eight times a year, each Federal Reserve Bank gathers anecdotal information on current economic conditions in its District and summarizes this information in the *Beige Book* report, published on the website of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve (<https://www.federalreserve.gov/monetarypolicy/beigebook/default.htm>).

As noted above, 12 geographic Districts which cover the continental US and its Territories. Most have Branch offices as follows:

- District 1: Boston, MA - no Branch offices
- District 2: New York, NY - a single Branch in Buffalo, NY was discontinued in 2008
- District 3: Philadelphia, PA - no Branches
- District 4: Cleveland, OH - Branch offices in: Cincinnati, OH; and Pittsburgh, PA
- District 5: Richmond, VA - Branch offices in: Baltimore, MD; and Charlotte, VA
- District 6: Atlanta, GA - Branch offices in: Birmingham, AL; Jacksonville, FL; Miami, FL; Nashville, TN and, New Orleans, LA
- District 7: Chicago, IL - a single Branch in Detroit, MI
- District 8: St. Louis, MO - Branch offices in: Little Rock, AL; Louisville, KY; and, Memphis, TN
- District 9: Minneapolis, MN - a single Branch in Helena, MT
- District 10: Kansas City, MO - Branch offices in: Denver, CO; Oklahoma City, OK; and, Omaha, NE
- District 11: Dallas, TX - Branch offices in: El Paso, TX; Houston, TX; and, San Antonio, TX
- District 12: San Francisco, CA: Branch offices in: Los Angeles, CA; Portland, OR; Salt Lake City UT; Seattle, WA; and, a short-lived Branch in Spokane which was closed in 1938. (Anon. 2025e)

Twenty-three different perfin patterns were used in 19 of the District or Branch offices of the System. Perfinned stamps are known from envelopes and baggage tags (Endicott 2021) Here goes!

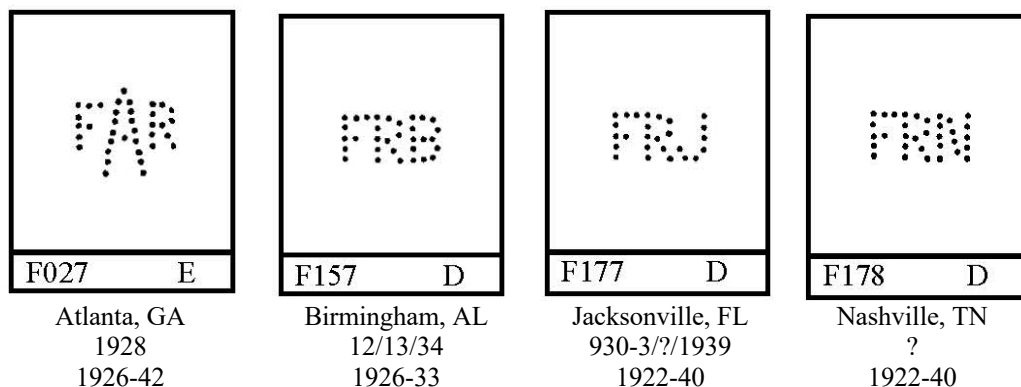
The District Office and Branch Offices in **District 5** (Richmond, VA; Baltimore, MD and Charlotte, NC) are currently not reported to have used perfins.

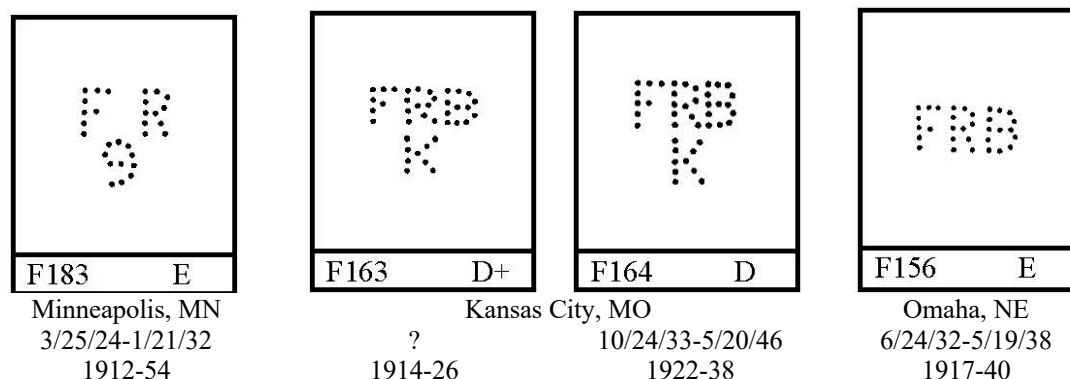
Figure 14. Front and back of a baggage tag used to accord the bag to which it was attached to "...be handled and accorded the same treatment as REGITSERED MAIL." per the tag

Registered mail was commonly used by banks and the Federal Reserve to return currency to the Fed for destruction or for replacement; or in interbank transfers of other securities such as bearer bonds. Registered mail was used to provide the highest level of accountability along the bag's mail route. Each time a bag changed hands, it had to be signed for.

Neither the New Orleans, LA nor the Miami, FL Branch Offices are reported as having used perfins.

Neither Chicago, IL (**District 7**) District Office and its Branch Office in Detroit, MI, nor the Saint Louis, MO (**District 8**) District Office and its three Branch Offices are reported as having used perfined postage.

The Minneapolis, MN (**District 9**) District Office is reported as having used perfins, but perfins from its Branch Office in Helena, MT, if they exist, have not been reported. And, while the Kansas City (**District 10**) District Office is reported to have used two different patterns, only Omaha, NE of its three Branch Offices is reported as having used them.

In **District 11**, Dallas, (the District headquarters is reported to have used perfins as did the El Paso Branch Office, and the Houston Branch Office (2 patterns). No use by the San Antonio Office is reported.

Flying to Albuquerque?

If you are planning to fly to the Convention city – Albuquerque International Sunport Airport in Albuquerque will be your destination airport of choice. Carriers including Alaska Airlines, American Airlines, Delta Air Lines, Southwest Airlines, Spirit Airlines, United Airlines (and several others; <https://www.abqsunport.com/airlines-destinations/>) fly to this airport at all times of the day and night.

And, once you have arrived, use the complimentary hotel shuttle service to the hotel. Or pick up a car at one of the many car rental agencies (including Alamo, Avis, Budget, Dollar, Enterprise, Hertz, National, Payless, Thrifty, and other choices see... <https://www.abqsunport.com/rental-cars/>).

Driving to the Convention?

From the Airport: SW on Girard Blvd SE toward Sunport Blvd. ; continue onto Sunport Blvd (0.1 mi.); continue onto Sunport Loop SE (0.3 mi); use the right lane to turn slightly right to stay on Sunport Loop SE (0.2 mi); turn right (138 ft); turn left (39 ft); turn right, then- hotel on left).

From anywhere else: From I-40 turn south on I-25 South (5.3 mi); exit E on Coal Ave. (5.4 mi); turn S on Yale Blvd SE (5.0 mi); left turn to hotel.

Things To Do in Albuquerque

There are many things to do in Albuquerque in your spare time, a very few free and many at a reasonable price. Prices below are per adult prices.

Old Town Albuquerque. The best free item is a self-guided tour through Albuquerque's Old Town. A phone app tour is available for \$8 to help you "self-guide". This is free only if you have a high resistance to good food and many artisans who will gladly sell you a variety of local crafts including jewelry (turquoise, of course), pottery, woven materials, and much more. If self-guided is not your cup of tea, there are at least two different guided tours of this historic district for relatively cheap (\$11 or \$15) and at least 2 different private tours, if you don't like group tours (from \$35). And there are even a couple of guided ghost tours of Old Town (from \$32).

City Trolley Tours. There are a couple of different open air trolley tours of Albuquerque (from \$35); plus an "Albucreepy" haunted trolley tour (\$50).

There are several different **scavenger hunts** should you be so inclined; Art in Albuquerque hunt; Nob Hill hunt; Albuquerque Art Works: Murals hunt; Albuquerque Bar Crawl - (each hunt \$13/adult).

Albuquerque Museum: featuring permanent collections of fine art, much about the history of the city and region, plus visiting exhibits. (\$6 - 9am-5pm)

New Mexico Museum of Natural History and Science: displays on geology, paleontology, astronomy and space exploration, and a great planetarium. (\$8 adult, \$7 seniors; 9am -5pm Wednesday-Monday, closed Tuesday)

Turquoise Museum Visit. Located in a modern 'castle' that is as interesting as the exhibits, the Turquoise Museum features a vast collection of turquoise jewelry and other pieces such as antique furniture. which you can explore on a self-guided tour. (online tickets required - \$20, Senior \$15 - varies based on ticketed time).

Petroglyph National Monument: open daily (variable times from sunrise to sunset; most 8:30 or 9am - 5pm) - six distinct areas listed by the USDI Parks Service, four of them with trails of easy to moderate difficulty where petroglyphs are visible to the hiker. See... <https://www.nps.gov/petr/index.htm>. Petroglyph does not sell America the Beautiful Passes. However, the Access Pass, the Military Passes and the Every Kid Outdoors Passes are issued free of charge.

Walk (Or Ride) On the Bosque Trail - 16-mile trail parallels the Rio Grande and runs through the cottonwood forest past Tingley Beach and the Nature Center. It's a great uninterrupted trail for a long run, bike ride or walk with the family.

Hike or Tram Sandia Peak: If you are looking for adventure, hike the La Luz Trail to reach the peak. If you want an easier, family friendly way to the top, the tram makes a trip every 20-30 minutes throughout hours of operation. The Sandia Peak Tramway is generally considered worth it for the breathtaking views and unique experience it offers. While the cost is a factor, many visitors agree that the ride up, the 11,000 square mile panoramic vista, and the chance to explore the summit are worth the price. (9am - 8pm; round trip adult ticket \$34 [senior \$29] buy online at: <https://sandiapeak.com/aerial-tram-tickets/>; also can drive the Sandia Crest Highway almost to the top.)

ABQ Biopark: (\$19.50 [Senior \$12.50] nonresident ticket for each individually; or combo ticket for all three \$27 [Seniors \$17] nonresident. Online ticketing recommended (<https://www.cabq.gov/artsandculture/biopark/about-the-biopark/tickets>).

- Zoo- Close encounters with more than 250 species of exotic and native animals.
- Botanical Gardens - Showcases plants from the American Southwest and around the world. The Botanic Garden's BUGarium is one of the most elaborate exhibits dedicated to bugs and arthropods in the country.
- Aquarium - Take a journey down the Rio Grande from Albuquerque to the Gulf of Mexico, visiting aquatic animals along the way.

And don't forget **Ballooning:** Lots of opportunity for a balloon ride over the local scenery. (\$185 and up).

Albuquerque is also the home of **Flamenco**. This passionate form of artistic expression combines singing (cante), guitar playing (toque), and dance (baile) with each element conveying deep emotions and stories, making it a powerful medium for storytelling and personal expression. Ask one of the locals at the hotel for suggestions. (Prec. Forum May 2025:12)

For those of you who might want to eat as part of this trip, there are several restaurants within a six block radius of the hotel including: the hotel restaurant Left Turn at ABQ (6am-11pm); Pericos (casual Mexican 7am-9pm Sun-Thurs, F & S till 8pm); Village Inn (7am-8pm Sun-Thurs, till 10pm F & S, 10% senior discount); 377 Brewery (Mon - Sat 11am - 11pm, Sun till 10pm); plus A Waffle House (24 hrs.), Fudruckers, Applebees & Little Caesars Pizza (variable 10:30-11am - 9pm-1am).

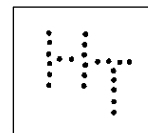

Spectacular 1946 Registered Cover Bearing 65 \$5 Statue of Freedom Stamps

Seen in Linn's Stamp News of May 12 2025 (pg. 14-15)

Perfined stamps on cover seldom have significant appeal for the general collector. Many still consider perfins to be damaged stamps and thus uncollectable. However...

On Mar. 22, 2025, Siegel Auction Galleries hammered down a cover franked with perfined stamps for \$1,888. Not exactly a fair description of the cover - this registered cover was franked with 70 perfined stamps. The perfin is the "HT" pattern of Harris Trust and Savings Bank of Chicago, IL. The stamps are: 65 x \$5 Statue of Freedom, Capitol Dome (Sc#573); 1 x 20¢ Garfield (Sc#825); 1 x 25¢ McKinley (Sc#829); and, 3 x \$1 Wilson (Sc#832). Both the front and back of the cover are shown below. Enjoy!!!
